The microfiber is super thick and absorbent to clean up particles and dust well. Think your floors are clean? Looking at this Turbo pad after using it in one room, my floors were definitely not. I'm super impressed with how well this picks up the dirt and grime! The thick absorbent microfiber really grabs dust and particles. 2.) Have a pet? These mop heads clean up pet hair nicely! Keeping up with pet hair can be a task in itself. Turbo microfiber pads are like a pet hair magnet! 3.) You can throw the pads in the washing machine to clean up to 100 times! You'll no longer have to buy the Swiffer brand refillable pads that cost around \$1! You'll be creating less waste and saving money by not using the single-use Swiffer brand pads that get thrown away. 4.) Use the reusable Turbo pads on your Swiffer wet or dry - your choice! I have tile floors downstairs and use my Swiffer wet, and then upstairs I have genuine wood floors I'm careful to mostly dust dry. Turbo pads work on all types of floors, including natural hardwood, tile, laminate, linoleum, and vinyl. 5.) You can now use your Swiffer with a natural cleaner! If you love using your Swiffer sweeper wet and looking for a greener more natural cleaning fluid, you can pair your Turbo pads using your favorite cleaner of choice. I will either lightly spray the floor and go over the area with the pads, or spray the pad and clean with it. Wet disposable cleaning pads created by Proctor and Gamble for the wet Swiffer are both effective and convenient. However, they're not recyclable or reusable. The disposable pads can create financial concerns on households that have to repurchase new pads. To ease the financial and environmental burdens, some households have tried washing and reusing the wet Swiffer pads. The results are never successful due to the chemicals, fabrics and other components that make the wet Swiffer pads work as a single-use cleaning device. Wet Swiffer pads are composed of several ingredients that make the cloth wet, clean floors and preserve the pads. The cleaner in the pads is propylene glycol n-propyl ether. (References 1) The chemical, also known as PnP, is a clear liquid that smells of ether. It mixes completely in water and is primarily used in degreasing and cleaning. PnP is also a paint remover. When you wash the wet Swiffer pads, the PnP washes away in the rinse cycles. The newly washed pad is then devoid of its primary ingredient. Preservatives in the pad work to maintain the soft durability that is needed to clean floors. Other proprietary ingredients included on the pad help perform the cleaning duties the wet Swiffer pad is known for. Some of these undisclosed ingredients are used to create a coating on the pad that helps it to hold up under use. All of these ingredients rinse away during the rinse cycle. Without these components and the primary cleaner PnP, the pads are useless after washing. Proctor and Gamble describes the pad itself as a "layered white nonwoven pad." (References 1) The pads are composed of polyester-infused polypropylene fibers that are durable on their own. They can withstand the single use, but may start to fray under the stress of the spin cycle and the aggressive heavy soil wash cycle that many pads need to get clean. You could wash the pads on the gentle or delicate cycle to preserve the fabric. However, the gentle wash isn't strong enough to clean the dirt and soil from a used pad. After the wash, the pad dries quickly. When dry, the wet Swiffer pads become hard, frayed pads that are useless in cleaning floors. The hard pad could damage some floors and finishes. You could mix up a cleaning solution of water and solvents to dampen the pad and add the cleaners. However, the soft durable pad that you once knew will not return. The washing machine manipulation, bleaching, detergents and hot water needed to properly clean the pads weakens the polyester-infused polypropylene pads, leaving them too unstable to be reused on floors after washing. Swiffer Sweeper kits come packaged in several parts and require assembly. But putting the Sweeper together is a breeze and takes only a minute or two. Each package includes a 360-degree swiveling head, a three-part pole, and an easy-grip handle.Snap the first piece of the pole into the head and then snap in each additional piece. Finally, snap the handle onto the top of the pole. Now you're ready to attach a sweeping cloth.amazon.comSTEP 2: Attach a dry cloth and sweep up loose debris. For sweeping up dust, pet hair, and other debris, use a dry cloth. Swiffer makes two kinds of dry cloths: Dry Sweeping Cloths and Heavy-Duty Dry Sweeping Cloths. Both styles are textured in order to pick up and trap dirt, but with its thicker pad and 30,000 fibers, the heavy-duty version is two times as effective as the standard Dry Sweeping Cloth.Push the cloth of your choice into the corner grippers to secure it in place, and you're ready to start sweeping. The 360-degree swiveling head makes it easy to sweep in corners and around furniture. When you're finished, remove the cloth and throw it in the trash. You can even try machine-washing the cloths on gentle cycle after placing them in a mesh laundry bag. They should be durable enough to hold up through multiple washes. For an even more eco-friendly option, reduce waste by using thin microfiber cloths that are washable and reusable.amazon.comRELATED: The Best Spray Mops for Cleaning the HouseSTEP 3: Attach a wet cloth and go over the entire floor.With the Swiffer Sweeper, you can skip the mop and bucket and instead use a wet cloth for spills, stains, and stuck-on gunk. Depending on the task at hand, choose either a Swiffer Sweeper Wet Mopping Cloth or a Swiffer Sweeper Wet Heavy-Duty Mopping Cloth. Attach the cloth by securing it into the grippers on the Sweeper's head. Because the wet cloths leave floors slightly damp, it's best to start in one corner of the room and work backward to prevent yourself from stepping in wet areas.Both the wet and dry cloths are reversible, allowing you to get twice as much use out of them.STEP 4: Use the scrubber edge of the wet cloth to clean stubborn spots.Swiffer's wet cloths feature a green scrubbing strip that is designed for getting rid of hard-to-remove stains. Flip the mop head downward and use the scrubber edge to rub at the spill or stain until it's gone. When you're done, your floors will look as clean as the day they were installed.Other Brilliant Uses for Your Swiffer SweeperWhile Swiffers are marketed primarily as floor cleaners, they actually have a number of other uses.
