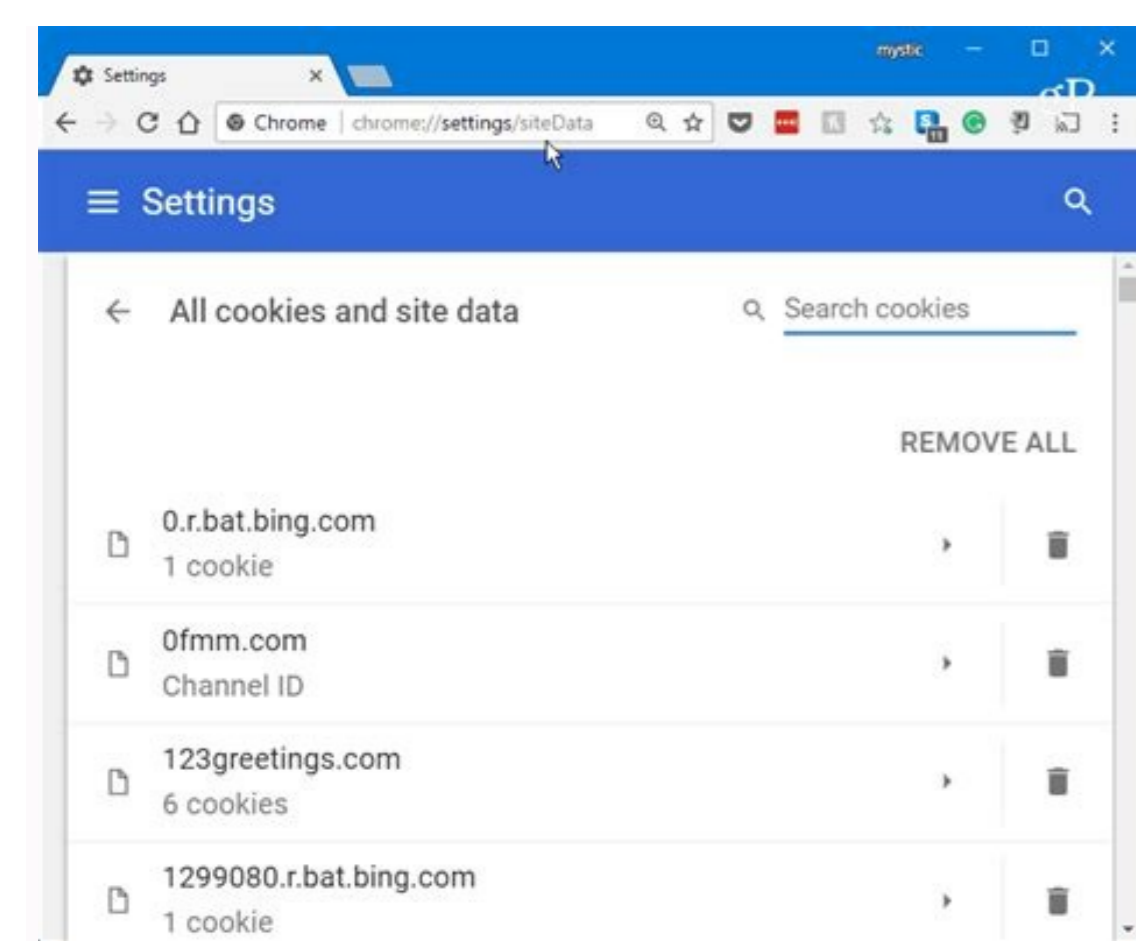
If you use the Apple computer, go to the Chrome menu in the menu line at the top and select the end to make changes. Click on the toolbar. Click the "parameters" ("mark as" settings "on Mac). In the menu on the left, choose confidentiality and safety. In the "Cookie files and websites" files, click the "Clean Data ..." button. Now just choose two options and prices. If you use a computer with Windows, close Firefox to save changes. If you use the Apple computer, go to the Firefox menu in the menu line at the top and select the end to make changes. Click Safari in the menu line at the top. Click the settings. Click the Confidentiality tab. Click "Management of the website of the website ..." click "Clean everything". Now click delete. Go to the Safari menu in the menu line at the top. Select the "output" to close Safari and save changes. Click on the "Tools" menu (three lines in the upper right corner) and open the settings menu. In the menu on the left, click "Privacy, research and service." In the "Navigation Data" section, click to clean it. Select cookies and other data from cash websites, images and files. The Clear History and Website Data button will be disabled after you have successfully cleared your cache and cookies. Open Google Chrome on your iOS device. Click the menu toolbar in the lower right corner. Select Settings. Select Privacy. Select cookies, site data, and cached images and files. At the top, set a defined time range for all times. At the bottom of the screen, click Clear browsing data. Then confirm again by clicking clear browsing data. Select "Cookies and other website data" and "Cached images and files", then click "Clear data". At the same time, you can also clear your browsing history. If you want to fix loading or formatting issues to improve your browsing experience in Google Chrome, clear your cache and cookies. Here's what happens when you remove them. What happens when the cache and cookies are cleared? When you visit a website, it sometimes stores (or remembers) certain information. Cookies record a user's browsing data (with your consent) and caches help websites load faster by remembering images, videos and other parts of a website from your last visit instead of having to resend everything every time you visit.

This means that all passwords entered on the site will have to be re-entered, and previously visited pages will take longer to load as the page content will need to be reloaded. Still, sometimes a fresh start is needed, especially when troubleshooting browser issues. How to clear chrome cachePreliminary cookies These instructions will clear the cache and cookies of Chrome on a Windows 10, 11 or Mac computer. We have separate guides for iPhone, iPad and Android. To clear the cache and cookies in Chrome, you must enter the browser's settings menu. There are three different ways to get here. The first is to click on the icon of three vertical dots in the upper right corner of the screen, swipe to "More Tools", then select "Clear Navigation Data". You may have noticed in the image above that there is a shortcut that you can use. To access the page directly and clear the cache and cookies, press Ctrl + CAJ + delete at the same time. You can also enter Chrome://Settings/ClearBrowserData in the address bar. Whichever navigation method you choose, you must delete your navigation data. The first thing you do here is choose when to clear your cookies and cache. Click the arrow in the box next to "Time Beach" to expand the menu, then select the desired time range. The default is "all the time". Then check the boxes next to "Cookies and other web pages" and "Images and caches". You can also delete your browsing history here. Once the checkboxes are checked, click on the "Clear data" button.



After a few seconds, your cache and cookies will be deleted. Select More Tools, then Clear Browsing Data. Or you can use the keyboard shortcut by pressing Ctrl + Shift + to open the same menu. This shortcut works in Chrome, Firefox, Edge and Internet Explorer. If you haven't already, check the "Cookies and other websites" and "No cache" checkboxes. You can also check the Browsing History box if you like.



To clear all cookies and cache in Chrome, select "All the time" as the time period. Click the "Clear Data" button to clear the cache and cookies. Instructions for Mozilla Firefox In Firefox, click the menu button in the top right corner. Select "Options". Or you can use keyboard shortcuts and press Ctrl + Shift + Delete to bring up the same menu. Select "Privacy and Security" on the left. On the "Delete" button. Select the options you want to delete. Select "Tous" for the "time zone for removal" to delete all cookies and Firefox cache. Make sure cookies and cache are selected. Click the "Delete" button to delete cookies and cache. Instructions for Microsoft Edge aside, click on a button with horizontal output points in the upper right corner and select "Settings". Or you can use the key combination and press Ctrl + Maj + Delete to view the same menu. Select "Data Protection and Security" on the left. Click "Select what should be removed". Make sure "recorded cookies and data" and "data and medium files" are checked. If you wish, select this option to deactivate other options. Click the "Delete" button to delete cookies and cache. For Safari instructions, click on Safari (Mac users only) on "Safari" and "Settings". Select the "Data Protection" tab and click "Web data management". You can see a list of all websites that have saved your data. Click the "Delete" button, and then select the "Delete" button in the next window. If it does not remove cookies and cache from each site, continue to empty the Safari browser cover. Click "Safari" and then on "Settings". On the "Advanced" tab, activate the "Development" menu on the menu panel.
