

It is hard to creep up on a fly and try to swat it. The fly can see your hand even if you come from above or behind.


Flies are useful. They get rid of all kinds of dead animals. They lay eggs that hatch into maggots. Maggots eat up dead bodies.

In a house or home they have bad habits. They dribble on food lying about. Make sure that all food is covered and flyscreens on doors and windows are in place.




